(B. Genl.) Felix K. Zollicoffer, TN 1812-62. A Veteran of the Second Seminole War who rode into a group of enemy & was drilled (he was nearsighted). Signature WE ..... 350.

(L. Col.) James H. Allen, 15th Virginia Cavalry, a Blacksmith's Bill February 27, 1865, 7 mending & shoeing jobs for a total of \$2.20 & brief Biography ..... 45.

Capt. John Frederick Allen, Herford, VA 1815-90. A Tobacco Merchant in Richmond & the first person in America to manufacture cigarettes. Signature as a Quartermaster (war date) ..... 50.

(L. Col.) Sam S. Anderson, VA 1819-1901. An Artillery Major in Mexico then on Huger's Staff & later Kirby Smith's Staff. ANS (AES) 2/16/63 "Trans Miss. Dept." ..... 60.

(L. Col.) F. H. Archer, Petersburg 1817-1902. Veteran of Mexico & Chief of the 3rd Virginia Artillery then postwar Mayor of Petersburg. Signature August 27, 1863..... 30.

(Generals) James J. Archer, TX (MD) 1817-64. Veteran of Wars versus Mexico & Comanches, captured at Gettysburg & died due to poor treatment. DS Washington Territory. This Document is also Signed by Charles Harker, NJ 1837-64 who was KIA at Kennesaw Mountain during Sherman's March, a future Confederate & a future Union General on the same DS, 2 BPPs ..... 325.

John B. Baldwin, VA 1820-73. A Signer of Virginia Secession, Member of CS Congress & Colonel of the 52nd Virginia Infantry. 1 Pg 3/28/1848..... 80.

M. Gen. Wm. B. Bate, TN 1826-1905. A Veteran of Mexico who was wounded at Shiloh & offered to shoot a Surgeon who wanted to cut it off. Signature as MG CSA...\$150., His postwar Check ... 100.

Henry L. Benning, GA 1814-75 who fought at Sharpsburg, Fredericksburg, Gettysburg, Chickamauga & the Wilderness where he was wounded. His Signature from a book he owned ..... 200.

Thos. Stanley Boccock, Buckingham, VA 1815-91. Member of US Congress & Confederate Speaker of the House. Nice Clipped Autograph..... 75.

(Generals) Wm. R. Boggs, Augusta, GA 1829-1911. A West Point classmate of McPherson, Sheridan & Schofield. His Check May 18, 1874 Endorsed by (B. Gen.) Wm. N. R. Beall, KY 1825-83 who got out of West Point in '49, a year after Boggs. 2 CSA Generals on the same Check ..... 290.

(B. Gen.) Solon Borland, AR (VA) 1811-64. A Major in Mexico on Genl. Worth's Staff who led Arkansas Cavalry versus the Union. His Signature ..... 75.

(Gen.) Braxton Bragg, NC 1817-76. Said to be about the crankiest General in the CS Army. His big fights were: Shiloh, Murfreesboro & Chickamauga. CS & CDV ..... 350.

(Generals) John Bratton, SC 1831-98. An M.D. who advanced from Private to B. G. in the war & Johnson Hagood, Barnwell, SC 1829-98. Hagood was South Carolina Governor & Bratton was Comptroller General of South Carolina. 1881 Governor's Document with others, 2 BPPs..... 275.

(Lt. Gen.) S(imon) B. Buckner, KY 1823-1914. West Point, Mexican War Veteran, Vice Presidential Candidate 1860. CS...\$200., DS as Kentucky Governor 1890 ..... 250.

(B. Gen.) R(ober) Bullock, FL (NC) 1828-1905. Three times wounded, Utoy Creek, Franklin & Murfreesboro and POW at Nashville. His 1904 Check Signed twice..... 220.

M. Gen. M(att.) C. Butler, Greenville, SC 1836-1909. He lost his right foot at Brandy Station. CS as Major General, Matted 8x10 & BPP ..... 250.

John A. Inglis, SC (Baltimore) 1813-78. Signer of the South Carolina Secession for Cheraw (our Declaration of Independence). AQS February 27, 1860..... 80.

H(enry) L(aurens) Ingraham, SC 1837-78. A Marine Lieutenant in the USMC then a CSMC Lieutenant. His father & 2 brothers were CSN. Clipped Signature..... 35.

(L. Col.) Allen C. Izard, Walterboro (Chester) 1834-1901. An Annapolis Graduate 1856. He was XO of the 11th South Carolina Infantry. ALS Walterboro 12/3/1889, 1 Pg Letterhead ..... 35.

(Dr. & Signer) John I. Ingram, Manning 1820-88. After signing the Secession he served as a Surgeon in the CS Army. ALS Manning May 10, 1868, 1 Pg..... 75.

(Capt.) James F. Izlar, Orangeburg 1832-1912. One of 5 brothers who served in the Edisto Rifles (Company A 25th South Carolina Infantry). ALS, nice Letterhead Orangeburg 9/11/1884 ..... 25.

Laurie T. Izlar, Orangeburg 1842-1917. Edisto Rifles under Hagood. They fought at Secessionville, James Island, Weldon RR, Ft. Sumter & Petersburg ALS Blackville 5/17/87, 1 Pg on Letterhead ..... 20.

Pringle Jackson, Moncks Corner 1832-1913. He served in Company D 3rd South Carolina. ALS August 26, 1886, 2 PP ..... 15.

(Lt.) Theodore A. Jeffords, Charleston 1836-1923. After serving as Adjutant 5th SC Cavalry, he served on Staffs of Generals Dunovant, Butler & Logan. DS Charleston 11/1/1872 ..... 20.

(Capt.) John R(andolph) Jeffries, Union 1837-94. He led a Company of the 15th South Carolina & was the son of a Secession Signer. ADS 1890 in Pencil, Signed in 2 places (Folio) ..... 20.

Wm. St. Julian Jervey (Jr.) Charleston 1847-1915. He served in the 8th Battalion of Reserves. ALS January 30, 1900, 1 Page as South Carolina Attorney General, Letterhead as Attorney General ..... 25.

(Major) John Jenkins, Edisto Island 1824-1905. Elder brother of Gen. Micah Jenkins who was KIA in this war. John was in the 3rd South Carolina & Signed the Secession. ALS as Berkeley County Treasurer 11/14/1890 ..... 95.

Wm. D. Johnson, Bennettsville (NC) 1818-1901. Magna Cum Laude at Princeton 1843. A Secession Signer who received a Medical Discharge from the CS Army. ADS 11/12/1867, 1 Pg ..... 45.

(Capt.) Lewis Jones, Edgefield 1815-92. He led Company B 6th South Carolina Cavalry (Dixie Rangers). They rode with Butler in Virginia & the Carolinas. ALS Edgefield 4/10/1853, 1 Pg ..... 25.

(L. Col.) E(rvin) P. Jones, Greenville 1815-? He was briefly XO of the 2nd South Carolina. ALS Greenville 12/23/1881, 1 Pg..... 20.

(Capt.) Charles Kanapaux, SC 1827-1900 & (Capt.) John S. Ryan, SC (NY) 1805-71. Their units were Palmetto Light Artillery & Gregg's 1st South Carolina respectively. DS 2/23/1855 ..... 35.

Clara Louise Kellogg, Sumter 1842-1916. The first American-born Prima Donna of Opera to achieve fame in Europe. CS 12/4/1875 Philadelphia..... 25.

(Dr.) Charles W. Kollock, M.D., Cheraw 1857-1931. He was an Air Corps Flight Surgeon during WWI being one of the first in America. Medical Document 1/1/1897 ..... 25.

(Capt.) K(osciusko) Kemper, Charleston (Alexandria, VA) 1835-1910. An Artillery Officer at Ft. Sumter for much of the War Between The States. ALS Alexandria 2PP 12/13/1895 ..... 30.

(Corporal) Charles Kerrison, Jr., Charleston 1839-93. Company B 2nd South Carolina, 4 times wounded at Gettysburg. Postwar store founder. LS 12/7/1888 ..... 20.

Hermann Klatt, SC (Germany) 1834-1916. He was in the German Artillery that captured Ft. Sumter (with others). He was at Hilton Head during the big amphibious landing. ALS 4/10/1886, 1 Pg on Letterhead ..... 25.

Florence Lake, Charleston 1904-80. Movie Actress whose brother was the original "Dagwood" in the movies. Pencil Album Page ..... 15.

Winborn W. Lawton, James Island 1837-1906. He was in the 10th South Carolina & postwar owned property that became the Charleston Navy Yard. ALS Charleston 2PP 8/24/90 ..... 20.

(Capt.) Thomas K. Legare, SC 1839-1909. He led Company F of Lamar's 2nd South Carolina Heavy Artillery. They defended Secessionville. ALS Orangeburg 12/11/1869, 2PP ..... 25.

John Rowland Leavell, Newberry 1820-1900. A Confederate Soldier, a merchant, farmer & a notable Baptist Deacon. ALS, 1 Pg 4/29/76 on his business Letterhead ..... 20.

Dr. Robert Leiby, Jr., James Island 1831-1907. Surgeon of the 2nd South Carolina Artillery. They defended Secessionville. DS 3/5/75 Folio Signed twice ..... 90.

(Capt.) James N. Lipscomb, Abbeville 1827-91. He served on the staffs of Generals Bonham & Butler and in the 2nd South Carolina Cavalry. ALS 1 Pg as SC Secretary of State 1/21/1886..... 35.

David Lopez, Charleston 1809-84. He built the David Torpedo Boats for the CS Navy as his 12 slaves were all skilled artisans. DS, an 1846 Mortgage also Signed by Dr. B. A. Rodriguez, the best known dentist in the CSA, witness by J. H. Solomon & Dr. J. S. Greenland (a CSA Surgeon). Others on this DS were all very prominent Jews ..... 300.

M. Gen. James E. Livingston, Charleston (Telfair, GA) 1940, a Medal Of Honor recipient from the Vietnam War. He sustained 3 wounds as a Captain while liberating a village. CS as Major General ..... 20.

Henry W. Lockwood, SC 1891-1944. Mayor of Charleston during World War II. DS as Mayor May 9, 1939 ..... 20.

R(ichard) C. Logan, Sumter 1832-1904. SC Secession Signer. DS May 23, 1874 also Signed by (Lt.) Melvin J. Hirsch, Kingstree 1840-1903. Both of these gents were Confederate Officers. 2 BPPs ..... 50.

(B. Gen.) Thomas M. Logan, Charleston, 1840-1914. One of the youngest CSA Generals. DS "Richmond & West Point Railway". Signed as President..... 225.

(Lt. Gen.) James Longstreet, AL (SC) 1821-1904. R. E. Lee's old work horse. ALS & Cover 1/16/1901, 3 PP as a Republican Bureaucrat in the Interior Department ..... 550.

Sgt. George Cottingham, Superintendent of Corral (1st Rhode Island Artillery). Receipt for 15 broken down horses June 19 (1864) in Pencil (at Petersburg) .....\$35.

Capt. Wm. Dickinson, New London 1830-87. He fought the Navajo Tribe prewar & had some close calls. At 1st Bull Run he was badly wounded, captured, traded & retired. Signature as Captain..... 20.

(Major) Robert P. Dodge, D.C. 1817-87. A wealthy merchant who owned a flour mill & part of the D. C. light company. He was a Paymaster. Endorsed 11/11/1870 Manuscript Check..... 25.

(Capt.) Wm. W. Douglas, Providence 1841-1929. He led a Company of the 5th Rhode Island Artillery. His 1901 Check w/Revenue Stamp on it..... 20.

(Col.) Mark H. Dunnell, Buxton, ME 1823-1904. He led the 5th Maine & postwar was a Member Of Congress. His Signature...\$15., His 1904 Check ..... 30.

(Capt.) S(tephen) B. Elkins, OH 1841-1911. Delegate from the New Mexico Territory, US Secretary of War & US Senator from West Virginia. He was captured during the War Between The States by Quantrell & had Confederate kin so he was not executed (77th Missouri). CS..... 35.

(Major) Victor A. Elliott, CO (PA) dates unknown. After serving in the 206th Pennsylvania, he became a Colorado Pioneer & a Member of the Colorado Supreme Court. 1876 Signature ..... 15.

Brevet Capt. Wm. G. Fitch, CT 1832-1914. DS in Occupied South Carolina 12/16/1868, a Receipt for an alarm bell turned over to Major J. W. Nichols ..... 35.

(Capt.) Joseph B. Foraker, OH 1846-1917. A Signal Officer under Slocum during Sherman's March. He later differed with Theodore Roosevelt on treatment of Negro troops in Texas. This ended his political aspirations. He was Governor of Ohio & USS. CS...\$20., DS as Governor 4/6/1889, real nice..... 45.

(L. Col.) Greenburg L. Fort, IL (OH) 1825-83. An Illinois Sheriff of Marshall County, IL who served in the 11th Illinois. Signature & BPP ..... 15.

(Brevet Col.) Chas. W. Foster, Salem, MA 1830-1904. He was English born, a veteran of Mexico & put 40 years in the Army. (Wartime) Signature..... 15.

(Col.) L. Col. George Gibson, PA circa 1830-88. He served in the 3rd & 5th US Infantries, was of Seneca heritage & was cited for Gettysburg. Signature ..... 25.

Capt. Othniel Gilmore, MA 1830-1913. Commander of Company B 7th Massachusetts. A final Pay Voucher for one of his men, James Fleet 2/18/1862 at Camp Brightwood ..... 25.

(Col.) John M. Glover, MO (KY) 1822-91. His Unit was the 3rd Missouri Cavalry. They saw action in Missouri & Arkansas. His Signature ..... 20.

Lt. Charles L. Goodale, MA 1830-1913. With Company G 36th Massachusetts. DS Petersburg 1/1/1865, a Voucher for office supplies Signed twice ..... 40.

(Capt.) James W. Grace (Sr.) Bristol, MA 1830-95. He led Company C 54th Massachusetts Colored Troops also served as Engineer & Ordnance Officer in & around Charleston, SC, became a Carpetbagger, left a well respected family at Jacksonboro, SC. ANS June 1872 as Treasurer of Colleton County, SC at Walterboro ..... 75.

(L. Col.) Wm. W. Grout, NH (Quebec) 1836-1902. He was the XO of the 15th Vermont Infantry & postwar went to Congress. Signature ..... 20.

Col. George M. Guion (?) He led the 148th Pennsylvania, was severely wounded at Antietam & was in the thick of the Cold Harbor battle. Signature as Colonel 10/14/1864 ..... 25.

(Capt.) M(ichael) J(oseph) Hagerty, Ireland 1835-1925. His Unit was the 141st New York. He spent 5 years postwar in the 42nd Infantry. Close of an ALS full page, speaks of Francis E. Warren of horse & buggy, also speaks of automobile ..... 25.

Capt. (Major) Geoge B. Halstead, NJ 1820-1901. A New Jersey Officer who became known as "The Hermit" where he retired in Minnesota. Army DS 8/9/1865 ..... 25.

(Senator from Ohio) M(ark) A. Hanna, Lisbon, OH 1837-1904. He served briefly in the Union Army & managed the election of President McKinley. Signature...\$20., CS..... 30.

(L. Col.) Aaron Harlan, OH 1802-68. (Ohio was the North West Territory then) XO of the 94th Ohio & a postwar Member of Congress. Signature ..... 15.

(Private) E(dmund) N. Hatcher, OH 1848-1917. He was in the 62nd Ohio Infantry & wrote a book considered a classic "The Last Four Days Of War". His Signature Columbus, OH 12/17/1891..... 20.

(USS Delaware) Anthony Higgins, New Castle 1840-1912. He served in the Union Army in 1864. His Signature as Senator..... 20.

(Rev. Col.) Thos. W. Higginson, MA 1823-1911. A Unitary Minister & Abolitionist who led the first South Carolina Colored Troops, later designated as the 33rd USCT. They were the first Negro Unit on the Northern side (Louisiana briefly had a Colored Home Guard CSA). ALS Ipswich, MA 6/9/1905..... 225.
