(B. Gen.) R(ober) H. Chilton, VA 1815-79. An 1837 West Point Class, a Veteran of Mexico & he'd
fought the Osage. He had picked up the wounded Jeff Davis in Mexico & was for a time R. E.

(B. Gen.) John B. Clark, Jr., Fayette, MO 1831-1903. His fights were: Carthage, Wilson Creek,
Elkhorn Tavern & Jenkins Ferry (wounded there). Signature as Member of Congress 75.

(Senator & B. Genl. of Militia) John B. Clark (Sr.), MO (KY) 1802-85. US Congress, CS Senator & a
Missouri Militia General who had been a Colonel in the Blackhawk War. His Signature (laid down) 75.

(M. Gen.) Henry D. Clayton, AL (GA) 1827-89. He led troops under Bragg in Kentucky & later
under Stewart. He was twice wounded Murfreesboro & Chickamauga. His Signature 150.

(M. Gen.) B. Gen. H. D. Clayton (Ibid) A Furlough also Signed by (L. Gen.) Alex P. Stewart,
TN 1821-1908 as a Major General & 7 others at Dalton, GA with 2 BPPs 1/12/1864..... 650.

(M. Gen.) Howell Cobb, GA 1815-68. US Secretary of the Treasury, Speaker of the US Congress,
temporary President of the CSA, Signer of the CS Constitution & Georgia Governor.
ALS 8/25/1856 as Member of Congress, 1 Pg 270.

(B. Gen.) Thos. R. R. Cobb, GA 1823-62. Howell's brother Killed In Action Fredericksburg, VA.
He Signed Georgia Secession. ADS 5-lines 10/21/1854 (Books \$1,950)..... 1,150.

Francis M. Cockrell, MO 1834-1915. His big battles were: Vicksburg, Atlanta & Franklin

(B. Gen.) James Conner, SC 1829-83. He led North Carolina troops & was twice wounded in
the same leg causing amputation. He was later Attorney General for Governor Hampton.

(B. Genl.) Philip Cook, GA 1817-94. A Veteran of the 2nd Seminole War who was wounded
at Chancellorsville & missing Gettysburg. Signature 90.

(Genl.) S(amuel) Cooper, VA (NJ) 1798-1876. Worth's Chief of Staff in the 2nd Seminole War
& later US then CS Adjutant General...\$80., LS as US Adjutant General 5/15/1855 170.

(B. Gen.) M. D. Corse, VA 1816-95. He was wounded at: 2nd Manassas, Boonsboro & Sharpsburg
where he was captured. Signature 85.

(B. Gen.) George B. Cosby, Louisville 1830-1909. West Point '52 Class wounded by Comanche
in '54, served versus the North then California Adjutant General. Signature SOLD

B. Genl. Wm. R. Cox, Scotland Neck, NC 1832-1919. He was wounded 3 of his 11 times at
Chancellorsville, that didn't shorten his life. CS as BG PACS or ALS, 1 Pg 1887. Each 225.

(B. Gen.) Wilmot G. DeSaussure, Charleston 1822-86. He occupied Ft. Moultrie as soon as
Robert Anderson left it for Ft. Sumter. ADS February 1873..... 75.

Wilmot G. DeSaussure (Ibid) ALS Charleston July 10, 1869 to the law firm of CSA General
James Simons, 1 Pg by this ex-slave auctioneer re a lawsuit 125.

John Echols, Lynchburg 1823-96. One of Stonewall's generals wounded at Kernstown.

(L. Col.) Charles J. Faulkner, VA (now WV) 1806-84. Diplomat & soldier on Stonewall's staff
jailed for disloyalty for Southern Sympathies then traded. Signature...\$30., 1876 Check 75.

Duff Green, AL (Dalton, GA) 1828-65. Quartermaster General of Alabama. DS Montgomery
January 21, 1863, a Receipt to (Col.) W. R. Pickett, Assistant Quartermaster General 75.

(Brig. Gen.) John B. Floyd, VA 1806-63. Governor of Virginia, US Sec. of War, wounded at Carnifax
Ferry, WV & died of disease. Signature as Secretary of War...\$145., ALS, 1 Pg May 11, 1834 245.

(B. Gen.) John W. Frazer, TN 1827-1906. West Point 1849 Class, he was career Army,
POW at Cumberland Gap. DS 11/6/1859 Ft. Semko, Washington Territory 220.

(M. Gen.) Saml. G. French, MS (NJ) 1818-1910. Wounded in Mexico this Grant classmate who
married a Southerner & cast his lot with the CSA. Signature...\$80., DS Austin, TX 1845..... 175.

(B. Gen.) Birkett D. Fry, AL (WV) 1822-91. He led Archer's Brigade after the latter's capture in
Pickett's Charge, 4 times wounded. Tiny DS, he's scarce 200.

M. R. H. Garnett, VA 1821-64. A Member of the CS Congress who Signed Secession & died of
Typhoid. ALS 1839, 1 Pg on politics 90.

(B. Gen.) L. J. Gartrell, Washington, GA 1821-91. He was wounded at Coosawhatchie, SC &
served in CS Congress. ALS Mount Sylvan 11/2/1841, 1 Pg 250.

(B. Gen.) Henry Gray, LA (SC) 1816-92. He led Louisiana Troops at: Red River, Mansfield &
Pleasant Hill and was wounded at Teche. He's extremely rare. Signature SOLD

Thos. Green, TX (VA) 1803-62. A Veteran of the Texas Revolutionary War & the Mexican War
who was KIA by Naval Artillery at the Red River. DS May 20, 1854 also Signed by John
Hemphill, TX (SC) 1803-62. Texas Pioneer, USS, Texas Chief Justice & Veteran of the
2nd (& bloodiest) Seminole War & 2 BPPs 295.

(B. Gen.) Richard Griffith, MS (PA) 1814-62. A close friend of Jeff Davis who was mortally
wounded at Savage Station. Prewar Clip 200.

Andrew Gordon Magrath, Jr., Charleston 1845-94. A Citadel Cadet who fought for the CSA.

A. G. Magrath (Sr.), Charleston 1813-93. Signer of the SC Secession & one of SC's CSA Governors.
ALS 3PP & Cover 12/6/1851 on politics with Cover mentions (Gen.) Chesnut, minor damage 120.

A. G. Magrath (Ibid) ADS November 26, 1855 removed from a larger Document yet complete unto
itself re 6 others Signed, 3 were members of the Gadsden family 95.

A. G. Magrath (the Governor) Engraving to go with the former two, add 25.

(Col. & Gov.) John L. Manning, Manning 1816-89. Secession Signer, prewar Governor & a member
of Beauregard's Staff & kin to 6 & probably more South Carolina Governors. CS 75.

John L. Manning (Ibid) who owned 670 slaves in South Carolina & in Louisiana, Visitors Roster
from New Orleans during the Mexican War also Signed by Genl. John S. Preston, SC (VA)
1809-81. Both men were Wade Hampton brothers-in-law & 2 BPPs..... 195.

J(ames) Matthews, Kingstree (dates unknown) Company H 10th South Carolina mortally wounded
at Murfreesboro in July 1863 & died in the enemy's hands. ADS (Kingstree) 4/22/1856..... 35.

(Major & Lt. Gov.) Wm. H. Maulding, Pickens 1839-1900. He was Quartermaster for: Hampton,
Hood, Gary & Mica Jenkins. ALS 2PP Hampton, SC 8/13/1879..... 35.

(Capt.) Samuel Wesley Maurice, Kingstree 1833-79. He led the D Company 10th SC Wee Nee
Volunteers & later was an Ordnance Officer at Mobile. ALS 1/8/1873, 1 Pg (Letterhead)..... 25.

(Gov.) "Burnett R. Maybank, USS", Charleston 1899-1954. Charleston Mayor, Lt. Governor,
Governor of South Carolina (after Jimmy Byrnes). His Frank 9/23/1943 as US Senator..... 25.

(Corporal) Alex McBeth, Company A Palmetto Artillery, son-in-law of Geo. A. Trenholm, Secretary
of the CS Treasury. Postwar McBeth was a prominent Greenville Industrialist. ALS 5/10/1884,
1 Pg from Greenville to a relative..... 20.

Charles McBeth, Pinopolis, SC 1805-81. Wartime (CSA) Mayor of Charleston. DS
December 1, 1859 as Magistrate. Louis DeSaussure (a CSA Captain) Signed twice. This
complete Document removed from a larger one with 2 BPPs 60.

Charles McBeth (Ibid) ALS, 1 Pg (Charleston) August 1, 1867 on legal matters re an estate
of John D. Habinicht 75.

(Sgt.) Charles Spencer McCall, Clio 1843-1904. He spent the war in the 20th SC & postwar ran a
store in Bennettsville & was a State Senator. 1898 ADS from his store 20.

(L. Col.) Edward McCrady (Jr.) 1833-1903. He was the XO of Gregg's SC 1st Infantry wounded at
2nd Manassas. ALS 1 Pg August 15, 1901 to CSA Genl. Brad Johnson, speaks of the late war..... 125.

Edward McCrady (Sr.) Charleston 1802-92. Father of the former (Jr. was a noted Author too). He
Signed SC Secession & later in the war defended Negro soldiers who were to be put on the
auction block for serving versus the CSA, 5PP 1874 ADS 2PP in his hand & Major CSA Julian
Mitchell also wrote much of the bankruptcy. 2 BPPs 100.

Edward McCrady (Sr.) who represented the Negro POWs. Signature 5/31/1881 35.

Thos. R. McGahan, Charleston (Madison, GA) 1825-1905. Blockade Runner & former 49er who
was Margaret Mitchell's great-grandfather. He had 2 or more close calls during the war.
ALS 1 Pg 12/17/1885, nautical content..... 70.

(Rear Admiral) S(am) McGowan, Laurens 1870-1934. Nephew & namesake of the CSA General.
He served in the Spanish-American War as well as WWI. His 1914 D.C. Check 30.

(Capt.) Edward McIntosh, Society Hill 1840-72. He served in the 1st SC under his brother
Col. David McIntosh. ALS Society Hill August 14, 1871, 1+ Pg..... 40.

(Capt.) J(osiah) C. McKewn, Goose Creek 1823-89. A doctor who led a Company of the 4th SC
Cavalry, was a State Senator & owned 30 slaves. ALS Oakley March 5, 1874, 1 Pg 25.

Dan W. McLaurin, Marlboro County 1843-1928. He served in Company G 23rd SC. ALS
October 8, 1903 as Commissioner of Land for SC, State Department Letterhead, 1 Pg 30.

(Col.) Fitz Wm. McMasters, Winnsboro 1826-99. Great grandfather of the SC Governor who led the
17th SC at 2nd Manassas & Sharpsburg then POW at Petersburg. ANS 6-lines 4/22/1888 75.

(Capt.) Hayne McMeekin, Union 1832-1918. He led Company F Gregg's 1st SC.
ADS Monticello, SC July 21, 1888, 1 Pg legal-sized..... 20.

John McQueen, Bennettsville (NC) 1804-67. He served in US then in the CS Congress.
His wife was granddaughter of Genl. Pickens (Revolutionary War). Signature 45.

(Lt.) C. Gustavus Memminger (Jr.) Charleston 1840-1905. A Staff Officer for Generals: Ripley,
R. H. Anderson, Sam Jones & Hardee. He was a citrus pioneer in Florida and died in North
Carolina. ALS 4PP Charleston September 3, 1887 40.

C. G. Memminger, SC (Germany) 1803-88. An orphan at age 4, adopted by Governor Thos.
Bennett. He was the first Secretary of the CSA Treasury & is pictured on CSA 5 dollar notes.
ADS part-printed 3/19/1858 195.

(R. Adm.) Edward Middleton, SC 1810-83. Son of a SC Governor, grandson of the Signer. He
served in the Union Navy versus the CSA. His Navy Check 12/1/1858..... 45.

Townsend Mikell, Edisto Island 1840-1926. He served with the Calhoun Artillery then with
3rd SC Cavalry, POW on Edisto. 1863 ALS 2PP 3/9/1905..... 25.

(Col.) Wm. Porcher Miles, Walterboro 1822-99. US Congress, CS Congress, Charleston Mayor,
SC Secession & Signed CS Constitution. ALS Richmond 5/25/1864, very light..... 75.

(Sgt. Major) John C. Millar, Charleston 1845-1915. He served in Kershaw's 2nd SC Infantry
then in Lamar's 2nd SC Artillery & was twice wounded. ALS Charleston 3/22/1893, 1 Pg..... 25.

"Lt. Thomas S. Miller" Company C 1st SC Cavalry (Edgefield Rangers). DS April 1, 1864
collecting CSA Agricultural Tax 400 lbs. of oats in Buckingham County, VA. ADS 1864..... 75.

BPP = Biographical Picture Page

(Col.) R. G. Ingersoll, IL (NY) 1833-99. Leader of the 11th Illinois Calvary, nominated for President by James G. Blaine. He's the best known free-thinker of his day. Signature...\$30., CS\$40.

(Sgt. & Rev.) Wm. R. Jervay, Charleston 1847-1910. Commissary Sergeant in the 128th US Colored Troops. Postwar he founded a Negro church, was a State Senator & L. Colonel of Militia. ALS (Pencil) 1½ Pgs. April 14, 1902 re getting out of debt to J. D. Cappleman, his white lawyer 90.

Capt. J. B. Irvine, MN (NY) 1831-1904. Minnesota pioneer who captured Col. B. B. Boone at 1st Bull Run who was the big catch for the day by the defeated Union Army. Signature as Captain & Commander of Ft. Wayne (Detroit) 30.

2nd Lt. John L. Jolly, SD (Quebec) 1840-1926. After serving in the 23rd Wisconsin he was a pioneer in the Dakota Territory & an early Congressman. Signature 20.

Capt. Jesse H. Jones, NY 1836-? Company G 60th New York Infantry. DS October 13, 1862, a Certificate for a Medical Discharge at Baltimore 40.

(L. Col.) Charles H. Joyce, Near Andover, VT 1830-1916. XO of the 2nd Vermont. They fought at Gettysburg. His 1883 D.C. Check when in Congress. 35.

(Col.) Wm. P. Kellogg, LA (Orwell, VT 1830-1918. Chief Justice of the Nebraska Territory, then Colonel of the 7th Illinois Cavalry & postwar Louisiana Governor. His Signature 40.

(Major) James R(igney) Kelly, Ireland 1834-84. 3rd US Artillery. He was cited for Gaines Mills & Fredericksburg. Signature as Captain 20.

Capt. John R. Kelso, OH 1831-91. He served in the 24th Missouri Infantry then the 14th Missouri Cavalry. Signature as Member of Congress from Missouri 15.

Brevet Major Rufus King, Jr. NYC 1838-1900. Son of the General & member of 4th US Artillery. He earned the Medal Of Honor at White Oak Swamp, Virginia 150.

Lt. Rufus King (Ibid) DS January 24, 1864. An Enlistment for a 25 year old Veteran soldier with the Eagle at the top just like on a Discharge 175.

Rufus King (?) Quartermaster 31st Wisconsin. DS Murfreesboro March 9, 1864, a clothing issue for 17 different items of attire. Signature as Lieutenant 30.

(Major) Charles N. Lamison, OH (PA) 1826-96. He led Company F 12th Ohio & later was Major in 81st Ohio Infantry & postwar was a Congressman. Signature 15.

(Col.) Wm. Lawrence, Mt. Pleasant, OH 1819-99. He led the 84th Ohio, was later a federal judge in Florida & a Congressman from Ohio. His Signature...\$25., WE 45.

(Maj.) Ben LeFevre, Maplewood, OH 1838-1922. Of the 15th Ohio. They were at Shiloh, Corinth then all of Sherman's March. Album Page as Member of Congress 20.

Capt. Dan M(ortimer) Lee (?) Enlistee to Captain 2nd Connecticut Infantry, 1st Sergeant 1st Connecticut Artillery, 29th US Colored Troops & retired as Captain 6th Infantry. Signature as Captain 20.

Capt. H(enry) G. Litchfield, NY ?-1902. a Private in 1862 then a Major in 1892 at his retirement, in 2nd Artillery with Sherman's Army 15

Maj. L. L. Livingston, NY 1831-1903. West Point 1853. He served versus the South in the US Artillery & retired as Colonel in 1895. Signature as Major 20.

(Brevet L. Col.) Capt. Andrew K. Long, IL 1843-78. He served in the 7th Pennsylvania Infantry & later in the 12th Tennessee Cavalry. Signature as Captain 15.

H(enry) B. Lovering, Portsmouth, NH 1841-1911. He lost a leg in the 3rd Massachusetts Cavalry & had served in the 8th Massachusetts Infantry. He later was a US Marshall and an MC. Signature ... 20.

(L. Col.) Theodore Lyman, Waltham, MA 1833-97. His service was on Meade's Staff. He's the III, his father was the Boston Mayor. Signature 20.

(Bvt. L. Col.) Major Stephen C. Lyford, NH 1839-85. He was a West Point Cadet & later taught there. His service was in the 3rd Artillery. Signature as Major of Ordnance 15.

(Maj.) Martin Maginnes, MT (NY) 1841-1919. His wartime service was in the 1st & 11th Minnesota Regiments. He later was a miner & publisher in Montana. His Signature 25.

(Gen. Mansfield) Orders Manuscript 1861 for Col. Cake, says to leave 4 Companies, draw 15 days rations, etc. purchase forage & an occasional beef 40.

(Col.) Major Wm. Augustus Marye, MD 1840-1903. An Ordnance Officer who also served in the Spanish-American War & retired in 1902. Signature as Major 15.

(Capt.) Samuel Mayall, MN (ME) 1816-92. Before the war he was an MC from Maine. In 1857 he moved to St. Paul, MN & served in the Union Army. Signature 15.

(Lt.) Moses A. McCoid, IA (OH) 1840-1904. A Veteran of Sherman's March: Ft. Donelson, Shiloh, Corinth, Resaca, etc. He later was an MC (Member of Congress). Signature 15.

(Maj.) Dan McCook, OH (PA) 1798-1863. He & his brother had 13 boys in the WBTS (several were Generals). He was an Army Paymaster KIA fighting John H. Morgan's invaders in Southern Ohio. DS 1834 Signature Manuscript 175.

Dan McCook (Ibid) Army Pay Voucher March 6, 1863 for an Army Clerk named James L. Barr. McCook was mortally wounded & died on July 21st. Document is repaired 295.

(L. Col.) Walter McFarland 1847-88. West Point Class of 1860 who served in the Siege of Charleston under General Quincy Gillmore. His 1881 D.C. Check 20.
