- (B. Gen.) Henry Gray, MS (SC) 1816-92. He made Brigadier General over Kirby Smith's protest & late in the war went to Congress in Richmond. Clipped Signature \$750.
- (B. Gen.) John Gregg, TX (AL) 1828-64. He was POW at Ft. Donelson, wounded at Chickamauga & KIA at Petersburg. ADS 8-line March 5, 1857 as Judge..... 900.
- (B. Gen.) Ben J. Hill, McMinnville, TN 1825-80. Fought at Shiloh, wounded at Richmond, KY also at Murfreesboro & Atlanta. 1869 Nashville Check Pen Cancelled..... 150.
- (M. Gen.) Thomas C. Hindman, AR (Knoxville) 1828-68. Wounded at Shiloh, Chickamauga & Atlanta then assassinated at age 40. Prewar Clipped Signature 275.
- Wm. H. (Red) Jackson, TN 1835-1903. He fought the Kiowa & Comanche on the Plains. He later led a Division under Forrest. DS also Signed twice by Union Genl. Elias Dennis, Newburgh, NY 1812-94. One of the scarcest & hairiest of the northern Generals. DS May 10, 1865, a Parole of Honor & Oath of Allegiance to the US, stain (not near these men's Signatures) 1,475.
- (B. Gen.) Bradley T. Johnson, MD 1829-1903. He burned Chambersburg, PA after Sheridan played arsonist all over the Shenandoah Valley. ALS Richmond February 11, 1869 150.
- Wade Hampton, Jr., Columbia (Charleston) 1818-1902. He was actually the 3rd Wade Hampton. He replaced the dead Jeb Stuart. Signature/Wade Hampton, Jr 225.
- Wade Hampton, the SC Governor who helped R. B. Hayes end the reconstruction (re-destruction) in 1876. ALS, 1 Pg Baltimore February 10, 1873 to fellow CS General James Simons 525.
- J(oe) E. Johnston, VA 1807-91. One of 10 men who were Generals in the US & CS Armies. ALS Savannah 3/15/1876 to Col. Del Kemper, 2 minor faults & his FDC (his Stamp). Books \$850, ours 650.
- (Genl.) J(oe) E. Johnston, Lee's old classmate who was 10 times wounded by Indians, Mexicans & Yankees. CS & CDV framed 380.
- (B. Gen.) W. E. (Grumble) Jones, VA 1824-64. After fighting Indians in Texas he was killed leading Cavalry at Piedmont, VA. Check 9/28/1859 to Charlotte Sibley (wife of the CSA Genl.) 250.
- (B. Gen.) Tom Jordan, VA 1819-95. Sherman's West Point roommate & later Beauregard's Chief of Staff. Partial ALS to Genl. Jesup 5/10/1853, 6-lines as Captain 140.
- Tom Jordan, ALS 4PP 1/20/1888, 4 separate pages to Gen. Marcus J. Wright (TN) re selling a silver mine..... 165.
- (M. Gen) J(ames) L. Kemper, VA 1823-95. He turned the tide at 2nd Manassas & was shot, captured & rescued in Pickett's Charge, then postwar was Virginia Governor. Richmond Check 11/4/1882 225.
- (B. Gen.) J(ohn) D. Kennedy, Camden, SC 1840-96. A scarce Gettysburg General (5 wounds) who was postwar Lt. Gov. of SC. DS 9/11/1855...\$275., ALS February 2, 1884. Both items, 1 Pg each ALS..... 345.
- (Maj.) Emil La Sere, New Orleans (Haiti) 1802-82. Of the 10th Louisiana & later Chief Quartermaster Trans Mississippi Department. A tiny man with a hot temper who won most of his 18 duels in New Orleans, the dueling capital of North America. Signature & 4 words 50.
- (M. Gen.) Evander M. Law, AL (SC) 1836-1920. The father of Florida's public school system. This Citadel man was in the elite 4th Alabama, 2 wounds, fought at Gettysburg & Chickamauga. DS Florida February 1, 1861 & Photo 750.
- (B. Gen.) Col. D(an) Leadbetter, AL (ME) 1811-66. He was 3rd in the 1836 West Point Class, put 20 years in the US Army then chose the South. ADS Ft. Morgan, AL February 1, 1861 395.
- (Lt. Gen.) Capt. Steven D. Lee, Charleston 1833-1908. Certified true copy as Captain of a letter to him by Col. A.C. Myers, Quartermaster General June 3, 1861 475.
- (US & CS Maj. Gen.) Fitzhugh Lee, Fairfax, June 14, 1898 Governor of Virginia & Ambassador or Consulate to Cuba. ALS 5PP & Cover from Cuba. He speaks of riots & goings on in Cuba to his wife, fully Signed as is the Cover (Mrs. Fitzhugh Lee is on Letterhead), fair condition..... 275.
- (B. Gen.) Thomas M. Logan, Charleston 1840-1914. One of the youngest CSA Generals (twice wounded). Railroad Stock "Richmond & West Point Railway" as President 1882 225.
- (Lt. Gen.) James Longstreet, AL (SC) 1821-1904. Lee's old workhorse wounded by friendly fire at the Wilderness. ALS & Cover, 3PP 1/16/1901 as a McKinley Bureaucrat to a lady back home 525.
- (Senator & Rev. Dr.) John W. Lewis, GA (Spartanburg) 1801-65. A preacher, a medical doctor, manufacturer, state Senator & CSA Federal Senator & mentor of Gov. Joe E. Brown. ALS 1/12/1863 somewhat light yet legible, he's scarce, 1863 ALS 195.
- L(unsford) L. Lomax, VA (RI) 1835-1913. An Army brat & Rhode Island's only CSA General who led cavalry at Gettysburg. CS postwar as M. General & ANS 195.
- (Gov.) A. G. Magrath, Charleston 1813-93. Signer of the South Carolina Secession & CSA Gov. of SC. TLS Charleston 11/14/1891 to W. E. Huger (Sgt. Major 10th SC) re a railroad lawsuit 100.
- (M. Gen.) J. Bankhead Magruder, VA 1810-71. West Pointer as of 1830 a/k/a Prince John. DS April 1859 as Brevet L. Colonel at Ft. Adams, RI, 8x5 is the size 195.
- (M. Gen.) Wm. Mahone, VA 1826-95. One of Lee's stars at Gettysburg & postwar RR President as well as a State & US Congressman. Signature..\$70., Railroad Stock Certificate as President .. 195.
- (Brig. Genl.) J(ames) G. Martin, Elizabeth City, NC 1819-78. His nickname was "Old One Wing" as he lost an arm in Mexico. LS 7/23/1856 on Army business, Letter backed for strength (laid down) 120.
- J. G. Martin (Ibid) ANS on Verso of a1 page Requisition for groceries being shipped from Ft. Leavenworth to Ft. Riley May 23, 1860 to (Genl.) Steve Van Vleet) & Jeb Stuart mentioned 175.
- Maj. Genl. (W. T.) Martin, KY 1823-1910 who led a Cavalry Division under Wheeler. ANS in 3rd person 2/10/1865 Signed in the text 265.
- (B. Gen.) Humphrey Marshall, KY (VA) 1812-72. A Colonel in Mexico then a CSA General. This ex-Minister to China fought Garfield in West Virginia. His Signature 90.
- J(ames) M. Mason, D.C. 1798-1871. US Senator from Virginia then a CSA Diplomat captured on a British Ship (HMS Trent). Signature...\$50., ALS from Senate February 24, 1854 (hard to read)..... 125.

Thomas W. Glover, Orangeburg (Goose Creek) 1796-1884. Signer who unwillingly loaned his home to Sherman for a temporary headquarters. ALS Orangeburg May 23, 1884	75.
(Col.) Robert N. Gourdin, Berkeley 1812-94. A signer & Colonel of a Reserve Regiment. DS December 22, 1885 with his kinsmen	50.

John A. Inglis, Cheraw (Baltimore) 1813-78. A Dickinson College Alum (at age 16) whose home was deliberately burned by Sherman who believed he wrote the Secession Document. ALS Charleston, 1 Pg 2/27/1860...\$60., ALS Baltimore 5/29/1870, his birthplace where he moved back to after losing most everything in South Carolina, 1 Pg (Dear Genl.) ?	65.
(Dr.) John I(saac) Ingram, Manning (Darlington) 1820-88. After signing for Clarendon, he served as a surgeon in the Confederate Army. ADS 7-lines 7/11/1867	75.
(Major) John Jenkins, Edisto 1824-1905. Elder brother of Genl. Micah Jenkins who was KIA in the war. John was with the SC 3rd Cavalry. ALS as Berkeley County Treasurer, 1 Pg 1890	95.
Wm. E. Johnson, Bennettsville (NC) 1818-1901. Magna Cum Laude at Princeton 1843. He's a signer who received a Medical Discharge from the CS Army. ADS 11/12/1867.....	50.
Richard C. Logan, Sumter District 1832-1904. He was 2nd youngest signer & was founder of the "Kingstree Star" & signed for Williamsburg District. ADS 2-lines June 9, 1872...\$50., ADS May 23, 1874 also Signed by (Lt. CSA) Melvin J. Hirsch, Kingstree 1840-1903 who after the war was a law partner in Kingstree with a Negro Union Army Officer, 1 Pg	75.
A. G. M. (CSA Governor Andrew G. Magrath) Charleston 1813-93. A Unionist who changed, signed Secession & was CSA Governor of SC. ANS, a 15-line note to H.A.M. Smith.....	50.
(Gov. & Signer) A. G. Magrath (Ibid) who was also a Federal Judge under US & CS Governments. DS undated but probably prewar as Genl. Simon's also Signed (Simons & Simons).....	75.
Edward McCrady (Sr.) Charleston 1802-92. ADS Signed in 1866 & again in 1868 on a mortgage dated 1862 also Signed by Z. B. Oakes (his mortgage). He was perhaps Charleston's top slave trader. 2 BPPs...\$90., WE	110.
Edward McCrady (Sr.) (Ibid) Father of the noted CSA Colonel & noted historian Ed. McCrady, Jr., the senior McCrady was attorney for Negro troops captured near Charleston who attempted to keep them off of the auction block. ALS 77 Broad Street (Charleston) to Genl. James Simons, no date.....	75.
Christopher Memminger, Charleston (Germany) 1803-88. Migrated here as an infant, orphaned at age 2, adopted by Gov. Bennet of SC. He grew up to be Secretary of the Confederate Treasury & later Superintendent of Charleston County Public Schools. DS Charleston March 19, 1858, a Gas Light Stock Receipt	195.

Capt. M(ichael) C. McNamara, Company E 17th Massachusetts. DS Baltimore November 1, 1861, a Certificate for one of his Privates to receive a Medical Discharge, closely trimmed on left side 25.

Wayne MacVeagh, PA 1833-1917. He was briefly a Major of Pennsylvania Cavalry & postwar he was Attorney General for Presidents Garfield & Arthur as well as a Diplomat. CS D.C. 2/10/1903 25.

Capt. John I Mitchell, PA 1838-1907. After serving in the 136th Pennsylvania Infantry he served in both House & Senate in D.C. Signature as MC (Member of Congress)..... 20.

(Col.) William G. Moore, D.C. 1829-98. Union soldier, Private Secretary to President Andrew Johnson, Police Chief of the District of Columbia & an Army Paymaster. Signature 8/15/1866 Signed in the executive mansion (White House) 30.

(Capt.) H(enry) L(ee) Morey, OH 1841-1902. Union soldier, Abolitionist & a Conductor on the Underground Railroad. He later served in Congress. Signature 25.

(Col.) Major Orlando H. Moore, Colonel of the 25th Michigan. They were at Stone's River & on Sherman's March to the Sea. Signature as Major Commanding Post 20.

Wm. W. Morrow, CA (IN) 1843-1929. He was in California by 1859, served in the D.C. National Rifles (Union Army), was a Special Agent for the Treasury Department & an MC after the war. Album Page...\$20., ALS January 4, 1886 re Chinese immigration, 2 Separate Pages 50.

(Major) Leonard Myers, PA 1827-1905. His Reserve Unit, the 9th Pennsylvania Reserves, was activated during the Gettysburg invasion. Signature as MC 15.

PFC C(has.) A. Orr, Holland, NY 1848-1923. A War Department Clerk who earned his MOH at Hatcher's Run, VA at age 16 for rescuing several helpless wounded off the field. TLS 8/10/1899 ... 120.

(L. Col.) Benj. S. Pardee who served as XO of the 10th Connecticut Infantry. ALS Hilton Head, SC December 10, 1867 legal gibberish as a Carpet Bag Ambulance Chaser, 1 Pg..... 30.

(Senator) John J. Patterson, SC (PA) 1830-1912. A Brevet Major in the 15th US Infantry who postwar was a SC Carpetbagger & our Senator. Signature as Senator & Signature as Bvt. Major. Each 20.

(Senator) Thomas M. Patterson, IN (Ireland) 1839-1916. After serving in the 11th Indiana Volunteer Infantry he migrated to Colorado Territory in 1871 & became their US Senator in 1901. CS as Senator 25.

Stanton J. Peelle, IN 1843-1928. His unit was Company G 8th Regiment Indiana Volunteer Infantry & postwar he was made a Federal Judge by President B. Harrison then promoted by T. Roosevelt. Signature 20.

(Capt.) S(am) R. Peters, KS (OH) 1842-1910. He rose from PFC to Captain in the 73rd Ohio. Postwar Kansas sent him to Congress. Signature 4/18/1884 as MC..... 20.

(Major) A(ugustus) H. Pettibone, OH 1835-1918. He served in the 20th Wisconsin, they had 50 killed & 154 wounded at Prairie Grove, Arkansas. Signature as Tennessee Carpetbagger 20.

(L. Col.) P(reston) B. Plumb, KS (OH) 1837-91. He served in the 11th Kansas Infantry which morphed into 11th Kansas Cavalry. They fought Missouri Confederates & Nebraska Indians. He later went to the Senate. Signature 20.

(Rev.) H(enry) O. Pratt, IA (ME) 1838-1931. This Methodist Episcopal Minister served in the 37th Iowa Infantry Volunteers. Album Page as MC (Member of Congress)..... 20.

(Col. & US Senator) M(att) S. Quay, PA 1833-1904. He led the 134th Pennsylvania & was awarded the Medal Of Honor for Fredericksburg. CS "M.S. Quay" ...\$60., His Check Washington 1/23/1888 90.

James Rafferty, Oath of Allegiance 2/6/1862 as an Army Recruit Unit is not stated. His oath is certified by a J.P. & his health is certified by a surgeon, 8x4 is the size 75.

(Capt.) J(ohn) Raines, NY 1840-1909. He led Company G 85th New York in the Army of the Potomac & in North Carolina. Postwar he wrote the Raines act which prohibited booze on Sunday accept in hotels. CS 12/13/1900 25.

(Capt.) Jos(eph) Rankin, WI (NJ) 1833-86. He led Company B 26th Wisconsin. They were at Gettysburg & later on Sherman's March. Signature as MC 20.

1st Lt. James R. Raynor, who had been 1st Sgt. Company E 13th Wisconsin. DS Louisville June 20, 1865, a Muster Roll listing 6 persons hired by Col. F. H. West 35.

Noah Webster, West Hartford 1758-1843. Lexicographer, textbook pioneer, spelling reformer & father of the American Language. He authored the first American Dictionary. CS (actually a Harvard lecture Pass) it says "Admit the Bearer, N. Webster". Note: we do not spell words nor pronounce them as our British cousins do; therefore I submit they murder the American language. This Card WE 375.

Charles Clayton, CA (England) 1825-85. A California '49er who was a Member of Congress from the left coast during the WBTS. San Francisco was his home. Signature \$25.

(Major) Frank Clendenin, IL (NY) 1828-82. During the War Between The States he served in the 147th IL then died young in a Montana mining accident. Album Page Signed 20.

Stephen A. Cobb, KS (ME) 1833-78. He was a Brevet Major in the Union Army & was Mayor of Wyandotte, Kansas Territory then served in his state & federal legislature. Signature 20.

Cornelius Cole, CA (NY) 1822-1924. Another '49er, was a Captain in the Union Army & served in Congress & the Senate. His Signature 25.

(Col.) Wm. Crooks, MN (NY) 1832-1907. His 6th Minnesota fought the Sioux, never the CSA. As a railroader he drove the first RR spike in Minnesota. RR DS 1903 60.

"Brig. Genl." J(ohn) W. Davidson, Fairfax, VA 1824-81. This 1845 West Point graduate had a grandfather (B. Gen.) in the Revolutionary War. He was wounded by Apaches in 1854. "Black Jack" as he was called later fought in the Red River War versus Comanche, Kiowa, Cheyenne & Arapaho and captured 400 Indians & 2000 horses. DS Natchez 4/28/1865 also Signed by Capt. Adam Kemper who led a Company of the 6th Colored Artillery versus the South 145.

Lorenzo Dickerson, Chickasaw Nation (IL) 1874-1929. A Deputy US Marshall in the Nation who married into the tribe. He was Indian Commissioner & Legal Council for this (civilized tribe). DS 1906 one year before Oklahoma statehood. US Marshall G. A. Porter also Signed 35.

(L. Col.) Capt. J(acob) C. DeGress, MO (Germany) 1842-94. A Veteran of the Union Army who postwar worked for the Freedman's Bureau in Texas then led Buffalo Soldiers in the 9th Cavalry & finally was the Mayor of Austin, Texas. Signature as Captain, retired 20.

A(ugustus) C. Dodge, IA (MO) 1812-83. An Iowa Pioneer who was their Territorial Delegate to Congress, an original US Senator from the state, a Veteran of the Black Hawk & other Indian Wars. Album Page Signed 25.

Henry Dodge, WI (Vincennes, IN) 1782-1867. The first American child ever born in what is now the state of Indiana. He was a Veteran of 1812 & the Black Hawk Wars. Signature 75.

James Duane Doty, MI Territory (NY) 1799-1865. He was the second Governor of the Wisconsin Territory then the 5th Utah Territory Governor. He was a Detroit pioneer. Signature 25.

Charles Durkee, WI (VT) 1805-70. A founder of Kenosha, WI then their US Senator and the 6th Governor of Utah Territory. His Frank (front) 25.

J(ames) T. Farley, CA (VA) 1829-86. He was the Speaker of the California House of Representatives then a state & later US Senator. Album Page in the California Senate, he was President Pro Temp. Album Page 25.

S(tephen) S. Fenn, ID (CT) 1820-92. He grew up in New York, moved to Iowa then California to Washington Territory and was Delegate to Congress from Idaho Territory when they separated from Washington. Signature 20.

(Maj. Gen.) Col. James W. Forsyth, OH 1835-1906. After serving in the WBTS he fought Comanche, Cheyenne, Arapaho & Kiowa on the Great Plains. Signature as Colonel 7th Cavalry at Ft. Riley, Kansas 225.

R(obt.) S. Granger, Zanesville 1816-94. After West Point, Class of 1838, he served versus the Seminole in Florida, taught in Wisconsin then on duty in Minnesota, Missouri & Iowa, fought in Mexico, served all over Texas till the WBTS & later served in California. DS 1862, A Certificate for a Medical Discharge for an Indiana man in the 6th Infantry. DS 75.

La F(ayette) Grover, OR (ME) 1823-1911. Oregon pioneer, 4th Governor who served in both Houses of Congress, Signed the Oregon Constitution. Signature 25.

Wm. M. Gwin, CA (Gallatin, TN) 1805-85. An original US Senator with Fremont who had been a Mississippi legislator, also a medical doctor & US Marshall of Mississippi. Signature 35.

J(ames) M. Harvey, KS (WV) 1833-94. The 5th Governor of Kansas, also their US Senator. He was a Captain in the 4th Kansas Infantry & is the eponym of Harvey County, KS. Signature 25.
