(M.G.) Dabney H. Maury, Fredericksburg 1822-1900. A stepson of Matthew Fountain Maury (his uncle) who lost a left leg & arm in Mexico. He fought at: Elkhorn, luka, Corinth was briefly Van Dorn's Chief of Staff. Pencil ALS Chattanooga, TN 1/3/1880 to Genl. Wheeler, 1 Pg..... \$295.

(Generals) Sam B. Maxey, TX (KY) 1825-95 & John T. Morgan, AL (TN) 1824-1907.
Back-to-back Signatures & 2 BPPs 120.

Gilbert S. Meem, Arlington, VA 1824-1908. A Virginia Militia General who saw action with Stonewall Jackson. He loved his drink & was later Postmaster (for G. Cleveland) in Seattle. His 1901 Check 90.

(M. Gen.) L(afayette) McLaws, Savannah (Augusta) 1821-97. He led a Division at Gettysburg in the Peach Orchard, Wheat Field & on Cemetery Ridge. 1876 DS as IRS Agent..... 195.

H(ugh) W. Mercer, GA (VA) 1808-77. He tried to be a thorn in Sherman's side during the March.
Signed Currency 1856 on his Savannah Planter's Bank as Cashier 90.

John T. Morgan, AL (TN) 1824-1907. After serving in the 5th Alabama he led the 51st Alabama Partisan Rangers. ALS 1 Pg 1/24/1879 to a CS Colonel on US Senate Letterhead..... 145.

Saml. P(reston) Moore, Charleston 1813-89. Surgeon General of the CSA & a Veteran of the Mexican War.
LS Richmond March 11, 1863 on Letterhead of Surgeon General. Signature Light but very readable 350.

(Gov. & BG) E(dwin) A. O'Neil, AL 1818-90. Wounded at 7 Pines, he also fought at Gettysburg & Atlanta. ALS 1 Pg Montgomery 8/20/1884 as Alabama Governor (Letterhead) 245.

Roger A. Pryor, Petersburg 1828-1919. He negotiated the surrender of Ft. Sumter & later was captured fighting as a Private because he didn't like sitting behind a general's desk.
ALS NYC 4/13/1868, 1 Pg to former Confederates in Charleston 175.

Philip D. Roddy, Moulton, AL 1826-97. A North Alabama Frontier Sheriff who later led a Brigade under N. B. Forrest. DS 9/4/1852 as Sheriff 250.

(B. Genl. & Gov.) A(lfred) M. Scales, Reidsville, NC 1827-92. A future NC Gov. who was wounded at Chancellorsville & again at Gettysburg. ALS 2PP 4/13/1884 on House of Representatives Letterhead .. 225.

C(harles) M. Shelley, AL (TN) 1833-1907. During the WBTS his big events were: Vicksburg, Franklin & Nashville. This POW after Vicksburg later was a US Senator from Selma. His Signature 90.

Wm. P. Shingler, Orangeburg, SC 1827-69. South Carolina Secession Signer who led Holcomb's Legion, 7th SC Cavalry & would have made B. General but for his big mouth. 4-lines Signed in the text..... 70.
Note: Shingler did not take Colored POWs (alive), when Jeff Davis heard of this his promotion was vetoed.

(B. Gen.) John S. Preston, SC (VA) 1809-81. A Harvard Confederate & Hampton's brother-in-law with (Col.) John L. Manning, SC 1816-89, a second Hampton brother-in-law. Both Signatures w/BPPs Clipped from an 1846 New Orleans library roster with 8 others 175.

B. Gen. R. S. Ripley, ADS 10-26-1863 moving Maxy Gregg's 1st South Carolina to Sullivan's Island, SC from the Army of Northern Virginia as they had many dead & wounded in their ranks, 2½ Pages Folio 675.

J(acob) Sharp, Pickensville, AL 1833-1907. He fought at: Shiloh, Murfreesboro, Chickamauga & Missionary Ridge. Prewar 1860 Pencil Signature..... 225.

James Simons (Simons not Symonds), SC 1813-79. A Militia General who fired on Ft. Sumter as the war began from Morris Island. ALS 1 Pg 3/29/1871 75.

James Simons (IBID) & James Conner, Charleston 1829-83. Both were CSA Generals.
Folio DS 4/29/1857, 1½ large pages re Railroad Trespass 125.

Pierre Soule, LA (France) 1801-70. US Senator from Louisiana in the 1840s & 50s. In 1854 he tried to annex Cuba. He also tried to raise a Brigade of Foreign Legion from the CSA. His Signature..... 60.

C(lement) H. Stevens, SC (CT) 1821-64. MWIA near Atlanta by one of Sherman's snipers.
DS circa 1855 re a large mortgage for Col. James Gadsden who added 45,000 square miles to the US (Gadsden Purchase). A 20-line ADS 475.

Ed. D. Tracy, AL (Macon, GA) 1833-63. After serving in the elite 4th Alabama, he was Killed In Action at Port Gibson, Mississippi. Clipped prewar Signature 225.

R(ober) B. Vance, Weaverville, NC 1828-99. Older brother of Zebulon Vance (NC-CSA Governor) who led Tarheel Troops in Western North Carolina & Eastern Tennessee. Endorsed 1885 (Ohio) Check 90.

James A. Walker, VA 1832-1901. a/k/a "Stonewall Jim". He was dismissed from VMI for trying to talk his Professor T. J. Jackson into a duel. ALS Wytheville 5/21/1889 Personal Letterhead..... 225.

Wm. H. Wallace, SC 1827-1905. A planter, lawyer, legislator then a judge who climbed from Private to B. General. ADS 2PP 2/1/1879 as a judge..\$225., WE 250.

Richard Waterhouse, TX (TN) 1832-76. He led the 19th Texas Infantry at Milliken Bend, Mansfield & Pleasant Hill. DS 11/27/1870, a Promissory Note Signed, light but yet legible 225.

Henry C. Wayne GA 1815-83 whose second claim to fame was commanding the US Army's Camel Corps for Secretary of War Jeff Davis. DS Washington, D.C. 10/19/1852 145.

Henry C(onstantine) Wayne (IBID) DS Milledgeville, GA 11/4/1864 part printed as Adjutant & Inspector General assigning a surgeon, excellent condition 245.

John Henry Winder, MD 1800-February 1865. Commander of all Confederate prison camps & Veteran of Mexico. DS April 30, 1862, a Discharge for SC soldier, some ink erosion 395.

A(bsalom) M. West, Marion, AL 1813-94. Quartermaster General of Mississippi Troops, Paymaster General & Inspector General. Postwar he was a candidate for Vice President with, of all people, "Beast Butler" Greenback Party. ALS April 11, 1862, a Pressed Letter with no Letterhead ... 90.

David A. Weisiger, VA 1818-99. A Veteran of Mexico, wounded at 2nd Bull Run & Petersburg. He was Officer of the Day (USA) on the day John Brown was hung. Certificate of Deposit 2/20/1871 or his Petersburg Check 12/26/1872. Each 175.

G(abe) C. Wharton, VA 1824-1906. He led the 51st Virginia then a Brigade under Breckenridge. DS with 32 other Members of Virginia Legislature (a few Confederates) no date (1890?) 150.

"B. Gen." G. C. Wharton, who fought at Ft. Donelson, New Market, Winchester, Cedar Creek & attacked D.C. with Jubal Early. Album Page (war date)...\$200., WE 225.

Maxey Gregg, Columbia, SC 1814-62. Secession Signer mortally wounded at Fredericksburg. LS 10/24/1851 printed Letter re nullification and/or secession if necessary. This is one of just 2 known copies \$3,500.

W(illis) B. Machee, KY 1810-93. Signer of Kentucky Secession also a Member of the Confederate Congress & later a US Senator. CS Laid Down 45.

(Gov.) Sam D McEnery, Monroe, LA 1837-1910. The last Catholic Governor of Louisiana (1881-87) & a Confederate Officer. CS when Governor 1887 with Envelope..... 50.

John McQueen, Bennettsville (NC) 1804-67. He served in the US Congress for SC then in the Confederate Congress. His wife was the granddaughter of Gen. Pickens (Rev. War). Signature 35.

(Col.) Sam K. McSpadden, AL (TN). He led the 13th Alabama, was captured at Resaca by Sherman's Army & had a Johnson Island Prison (vacation). ALS 1 Pg 9/12/1857 re Alabama politics 50.

C. G. Memminger, Charleston (Germany) 1803-88. Signer of the SC Secession, Signer of the Confederate Constitution & Secretary of the SS, CSA Treasurer. Pictured on CSA \$5 Bills. 1858 DS...\$175., ALS 1/16/1861, 1 page on Letterhead SC Executive Treasury Dept..... 475.

Franklin I(srael) Moses, Charleston (PA) 1804-77. SC Chief Justice, owned 77 Slaves & the father of SC's only Jewish Governor. Telegram 1876...\$25., DS 1/13/1868 1½ Pgs..... 150.

George W. Offutt (dates unknown). Postal Employee who also served in the 41st VA Cavalry Battalion & the 23rd VA Cavalry, also 3rd VA Infantry. Endorsed 1909 D.C. Check (these were P.O. Reserves).... 20.

(Col. & Gov.) James L. Orr, SC 1822-73. Speaker of US Congress, Colonel 1st SC Rifles, Diplomat to Russia, Signed SC Secession, Governor & dead at 50. Signature...\$75., ALS Anderson 3/2/1867 225.

Jos(eph) D. Pope, St. Helena, SC 1820-1908. SC Secession Signer, University of Georgia Alum. He was the collector of CSA taxes in SC & superintended printing of Confederate currency. ADS March 23, 1859 removed yet complete to itself 75.

(Col.) Ed E(dwards) Portlock (Jr.), AR (VA) 1840-87. He led the 24th Arkansas Infantry at: Elkhorn Tavern & Arkansas Post where he was captured. Railroad DS October 1883 25.

James L. Pugh, AL (GA) 1820-1907. He moved to Alabama in 1824, served in the CSA Congress & later was US Senator from Alabama. Album Page or CS. Each..... 35.

John H. Reagan, TX (Gatlinburg, TN) 1818-1905. He fought Indians in Texas & was the Confederate Postmaster General. ALS 1/1/1890 as US Senator stating he did not want to be US PMG, 6 Pages 525.

R. B. Rhett (Sr.) Beaufort, SC 1800-76. US & CS Senator a/k/a "Father of Secession". He Signed Secession & the CSA Constitution. His "Charleston Mercury" was as one-sided for Secession as the fake news is today anti-Trump. ALS 1 Pg 10/17/69 to Gov. McGrath's firm 525.

(Dr.) Robert B. Rhett, Jr., Charleston (AL) 1853-1901. R. B. Rhett's eldest son, a VMI dropout, a Colorado cowboy, then he became a doctor. ALS May 15, 1868 asking an occupying Union Colonel to pay his bill to the Mercury 75.

(Col.) Wm. P. Shingler, Orangeburg 1827-69. SC Secession Signer who led the Holcomb's Legion & later the 7th SC Cavalry on Edisto Island. His racist views caused him to be passed over for B. Gen. DS 10/24/1860, a Promissory Note 75.

Gov. John Gill Shorter, Eufala, AL (GA) 1818-72. Confederate Governor of Alabama & Signer of the CSA Constitution. DS 12/2/1862, a State Treasury Check as Governor for \$10,215 245.

Walter Leak Steele, NC 1823-91. A US Congressman who chaired the NC Secession Convention. Signature with 6 others off of an 1847 New Orleans Library Roster. Signature 45.

(A. H. Stephens) an 1841 Letter to him from C. B. Hilt of Augusta. Speaks of (Gen.) Hugh Mercer. Stephens docketed it 45.

Alexander H. Stephens, GA 1812-83. Vice President of the CSA & Georgia Governor. Album Page as a Member of Congress with 4 others, 4 Biographies & the Veep's BPP 225.

A(nna) H(olmes) Trenholm, SC 1801-85. Wife of Geo. A Trenholm, 2nd CSA Secretary of the Treasury. They had 9 children. DS 1881, a Promissory Note Signed front & back..... 35.

George A. Trenholm, Charleston 1807-76. Shipping magnate & king of the blockade runners (60 ships). He replaced Memminger as Secretary of the CS Treasury. It was he who established international credit for the CSA (he was the real Rhett Butler). DS 1868 135.

George G. Vest, MO (KY) 1830-1904. Missouri CS Senator who wrote a tear jerking "Tribute to a Dog" & collected for his client's dead trespassing dog. CS or Album Page. Each 40.

Theodore D. Wagner, Charleston 1819-90. Trenholm's brother-in-law & business partner. 1868 small DS with (L. Col.) Wm. Trenholm also Signed (Charleston 1836-1901) eldest Trenholm son. Small DS & 2 BPPs..... 60.

David S. Walker, FL (KY) 1815-91. Florida's 8th Governor elected in late 1865 (100% of the vote). He had been a Whig & was opposed to secession. ALS 1 Pg Tallahassee 2/21/1872..... 75.

T(homas) H. Watts, Alabama Territory 1819-92. Governor of Alabama, Signer of Alabama Secession, Col. 17th Alabama, CSA Attorney General. ADS 12/15/1864 ordering 2 gallons of whiskey for medicinal purposes. On Verso a doctor certifies to the use & reason (I'll bet) 250.

Warren Winslow, Fayetteville, NC 1810-62. Speaker of the NC Senate who became Governor of NC for 25 days as the elected Governor died in office. His Signature 45.

Major John P. Wilson, VA 1833-1922. VMI class of 1855, he led 5th VA Battalion, served on Jubal Early's Staff & with Company B 9th VA. ADS 9/9/1861, a Quartermaster Document 45.

Major John P. Wilson (IBID) ALS Headquarters Hardy's Bluff, VA 4/19/1862 sustained 1 wound during CSA War & also served on Ewell's Staff. Letter re Quartermaster business 65.

Welfare Check September 15, 1863 for a soldier named Wm. Saunders. His wife endorsed it on verso. Check is all manuscript approximately 6x3 50.

Wytheville, VA Confederate Letter to Capt. Isaac Shelby, Jr., Chief of CS Commissary, 1 Pg authorizing a victuals shipment November 9, 1861, laid down 45.

BPP = Biographical Picture Page

(Capt.) James S. Smart, NY (Baltimore) 1842-1903. He led Company K of the 16th NY Heavy Artillery. He fought in North Carolina & Virginia including Ft. Fisher, NC. His Signature\$15.

(L. Col.) George L. Smith, LA (NH) 1837-84. He was XO of the 107th NY. Postwar as a Carpetbagger he served in Congress, was Custom Collector at New Orleans & owned a Shreveport bank. Signature 20.

L. Col. Melancton Smith 1829-63. Provost Marshall of Occupied Memphis, with the 45th IL Killed In Action at Vicksburg. ADS 4/2/1863 as Provost Marshall. He has a monument on the Vicksburg battlefield..... 175.

Capt. Robert Burnette Smith, NJ ?-1896. He fought at Yorktown, Gaines Mill, Malvern Hill, Petersburg, Weldon & elsewhere. Army DS Trenton 7/29/1865..... 25.

(Lt.) H(enry) J. Spooner, RI 1839-1918. Company E 4th RI Infantry. At Antietam he had 2 bullets pass through his uniform. Postwar he was RI Speaker & a Federal Congressman. Signature 15.

George B. Squires, MA 1844-1910. A Union Soldier. Album Page Signed U.S. Grant Post Dept. of NY February 3, 1888..... 15.

(Major) 1st Lt. May H. Stacy (?) A Pass Fort Hamilton, NY July 29, 1863 allowing two New Hampshire soldiers to travel home for a Discharge, 1 full page..... 45.

(B. Gen.) Amos Stickney, St. Louis 1843-1924. West Point Class of 1864. He made Sherman's March, served on Genl. Cullum's Staff then taught at West Point. Signature 12/7/1864 25.

(Capt.) Joseph C. Stone, IA (NY), 1829-1902. He led a Company in the 1st Iowa Cavalry & postwar was a Congressman & a doctor. Signature 15.

(Surgeon) J(ames) D. Strawbridge, PA 1824-90. He served in: Missouri, Mississippi, Tennessee as a Brigade Surgeon in the 18th Corps & was a POW for 3 months at Libby Prison. Signature 25.

(Capt.) Charles A. Sumner, CA (MA) 1835-1903. He served as a California Union soldier, went to Congress postwar and was editor of the "San Francisco Herald". Signature 20.

Capt. E(lijah) D. Taft, NY 1819-1915. He led the 5th NY Light Artillery Battery in the Army of the Potomac (Gettysburg & everywhere else). DS May 1, 1862 a Certificate for Discharge trimmed 30.

Wm. N. Taft, Providence, RI 1847-89. Company B 3rd RI Artillery who became a South Carolina Carpetbagger, helped create a Negro town. DS 3/24/1888 to a Negro teacher 25.

(Col.) Mason W. Tappan, Newport, NH 1817-86. He led the 1st NH Infantry & postwar was Attorney General of New Hampshire as well as a State then Federal Congressman. Signature 20.

Ezra B. Taylor, OH 1823-1912. He served in the 171st OH Infantry & postwar was a judge then replaced Garfield in Congress. Signed Album Page with 2 other Congressmen, both were Union Army 30.

(L. Col.) Capt. Winslow M. Thomas, NY 1832-78. XO of the 60th NY. DS Baltimore May 26, 1862. A Certificate for a Medical Discharge PFC Jerome D. Moore 35.

(Capt.) David Torrance, CT 1840-1906. He was captured at the 2nd Battle of Winchester & spent time in Libby Prison. His Unit was the 29th US Colored Troops. He later was Connecticut Chief Justice. ALS 6/19/1901 30.

L. Col. Charles Townsend, NY 1837-64. Killed In Action at "Cold Harbor, VA". ADS 10-lines 12/20/1863. He died 6/1/1864 leading the 106th NY Infantry 90.

Adj. General of NY Franklin Townsend, Albany 1821-98. A former Mayor of Albany who served 113th NY Infantry & the 7th NY Heavy Artillery. DS as NY Adjutant General 6/28/1872 part-printed 35.

(L. Col.) Norton S. Townsend, OH (England) 1815-95. A Medical Inspector who later served in Congress from Ohio & was an Agricultural Professor. Signature 15.

(Capt.) O(rilando) W Trask, ME 1833-92. He led Company E 14th Maine. ADS undated appears to be war date, 1 full page Signed 4 or more times 35.

(Surgeon) H(enry) Van Aernam, NY 1819-94. He doctored the 154th NY & was a staunch Abolitionist. LS as Chief of the Pension Office, Interior Department 1 Pg Signed with indelible pencil 30.

(Col.) N(elson) H. Van Horhes, OH (PA) 1822-82. Editor, State Legislature & Ohio Speaker who led the 92nd Ohio then went to Congress. Clipped Signature 20.

(L. Col.) R(obert) T. Van Horn, MO (PA) 1824-1916. XO of the 25th Missouri, Mayor of Kansas City & later a Member of Congress. Signature...\$15., Album Page with another MC (Member of Congress) 25.

Gov. S(am) R. Van Sant, MN (Rock Island, IL) 1844-1936. Veteran of the 9th IL Cavalry who was MN Speaker of the House & later the Minnesota Governor. CS 8/1/1903 as Minnesota Governor 30.

(Sgt.) Paul Vandervoort, IL (OH) 1846-1902. He served in the 16th IL Cavalry during Sherman's March & was captured at Jonesboro, GA & survived Andersonville. ANS on an Album Page as MC 25.

(L. Col.) Wm. L. Vilas, WI (VT) 1840-1908. He served in the 23rd Wisconsin & postwar was Postmaster General for G. Cleveland then Secretary of Interior for B. Harrison. His CS..... 35.

(1st Sgt.) Jimmie E. Howard, IA 1929-93. An iconic Marine with the Silver Star & Purple Heart. In Korea with 15 good men wiped out 200 (of 300+) in a night long fight. CS 125.

Einer Ingman, Milwaukee 1929. A Soldier who overran a machine gun nest in Korea losing an eye & his hearing in one ear. CS 20.

(Naval Corpsman w/7th Marines) Robert R. Ingram, Clearwater, FL 1945. He continued to play doctor in Vietnam in 1965 while sustaining 4 wounds. Signed unused M.O.H. Postal Cover 40.

Col. Jack H. Jacobs, Brooklyn 1945. In Vietnam in 1968 he earned 2 Silver Stars, 3 Bronze Stars, 2 Purple Hearts & the M.O.H. He's a very scarce autograph to obtain. ANS INS to Rich..... 60.

Major Douglas T. Jacobson, Rochester 1925-2000. A Marine who earned his on Iwo Jima by silencing an Artillery piece & 2 machine guns. CS...\$30., TLS Personal Letterhead 12/22/1997 60.

(Capt.) Arthur J. Jackson, Cleveland 1924. On Peleliu he destroyed 12 pill boxes & killed 50, was wounded there & again on Okinawa. Signed 6x4 Stiff Flag...\$15., **or** his Signed at Citation Copy at 20.

(Sgt. Major) Delbert Jennings, NM 1936-2003. First US Cavalry. His was earned in Vietnam where he killed 12 enemy who were after his artillery. OCS & his photo 50.

(CWO4) Oscar G. Johnson, MI 1921-98. A soldier who held his position after all 6 of his mortar group were dead (with a rifle) near Scarperia, Italy. Signed 1993 Convention Cover 125.

(Sgt.) Leonard Keller, IL 1947-2009. This soldier with an assistant polished off 7 bunkers in Vietnam in 1967. Signed Copy of his Citation..... 75.

(Capt.) Thomas G. Kelley, Boston 1939. In the Mekong Delta on riverboat patrol he turned an ambush into a victory. 6x4 Signed Flag...\$15., OCS..... 25.

Bob Kerry, Lincoln 1943. A daring Navy Seal who pulled off a kidnapping up a 350 foot cliff in Vietnam. His fame got him elected as USS & Nebraska Governor. 5x7 Signed Photo 75.

(Spec. 4) Thomas J. Kinsman, Renton, WA 1945. A soldier who snuffed a grenade to save his buddies. CS...\$20., **or** Signature as Jim Kinsman, also 20.
